What's the Point?

Demonstrate knowledge about various media and techniques, both traditional and contemporary.

Deliverable:

Photo Gel Transfer of your New Perspective

Photo, taking laser print of your image and transferring it using Glue, Modge podge, or gel medium onto Water Color Paper

Requirements:

Print incorporating the following:

- Laser print of your image (or ink-jet if laser isn't available).
- Image pressed face down into Modge Podge, Elmer's Glue,
 Fluid Gel Medium on Water Color Paper. Let dry for at least 5 hours.
- Using finger and small amount of water gently rub off the paper revealing image.

Art Appreciation Project Rubric:

New Perspective Painting

What's the Point?

Demonstrate knowledge about various media and techniques, both traditional and contemporary.

Deliverable:

Painting, drawing, or collage done on top of New Perspective Print using it as a guide to create new work of art.



"Painting" incorporating the following:

- Choose a media to cover your *Prints*, trying out at least 2.
 - Options include but are not limited to Paint (acrylic, watercolor, gouache), Markers (Sharpie, Crayola), Colored Pencil, or collaging together several prints.
- Use the medium to match colors, textures, shapes, etc.
 - Focus on the main Formal Elements used in your New Perspective Photo.
- Problem solve. If a print has a flaw or mistake, for example, an area that didn't transfer, use the above materials to "fix" that mistake.
- Create 4 images using different media and pick the best one for submission.
